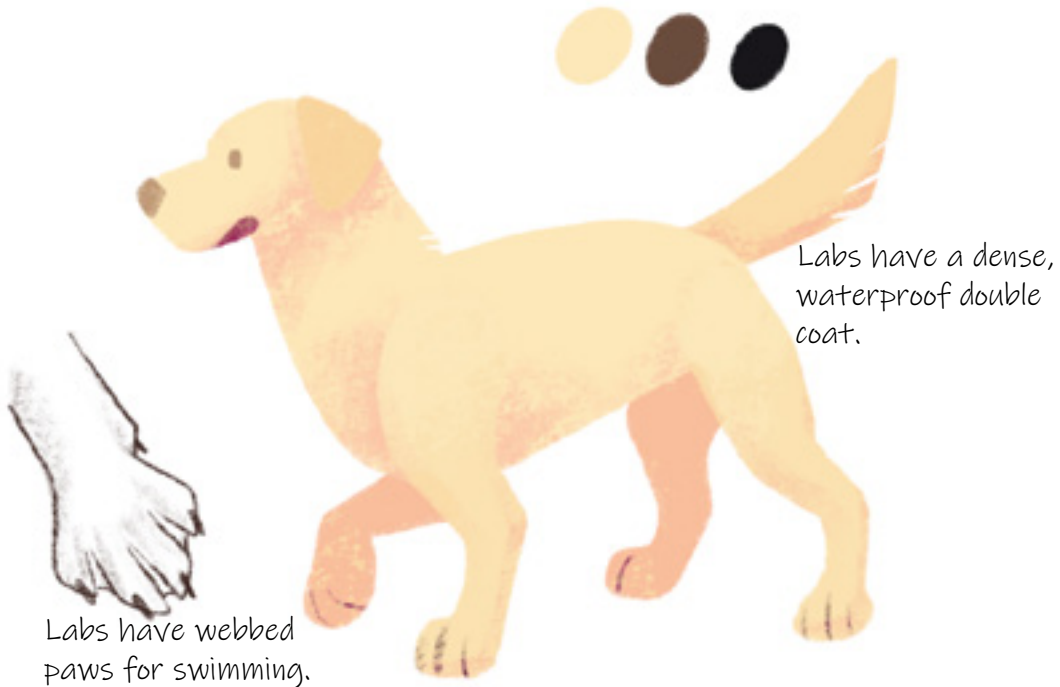

Labs have webbed paws for swimming.



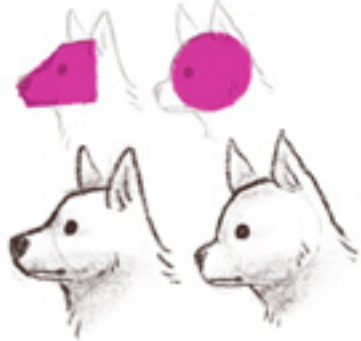
Originating from Newfoundland, Labrador Retrievers were bred for hunting and retrieving water fowl.

Dachshunds have wide paws with long claws to aid in digging.

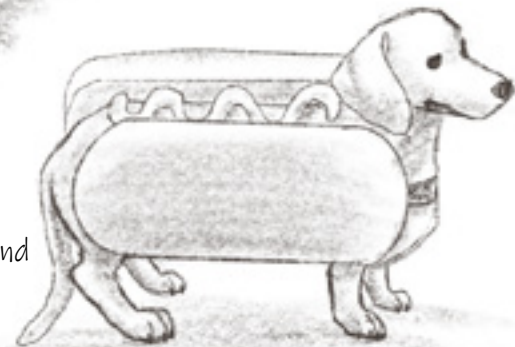


# Dachshund

Bred to flush out badgers from their dens, "Dachshund" means "Badger Hound" in German.



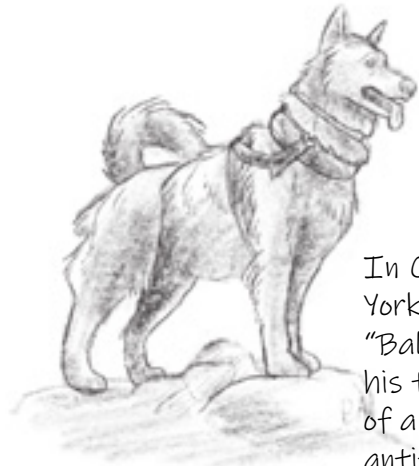
Dachshunds are often called wiener dogs, but they existed before hot dogs did. In fact, hot dogs were called "Dachshund Sausages" by some.







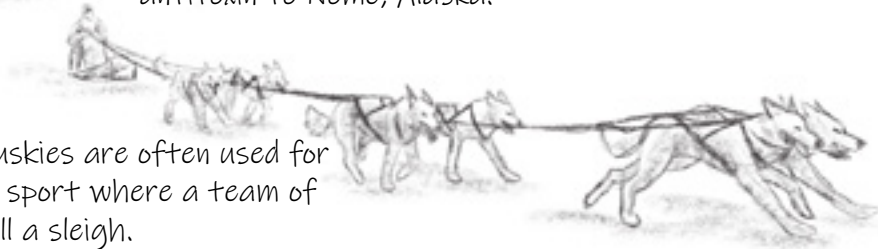
Huskies have a double coat of fur to help keep them warm in harsh temperatures. This also means they shed a lot.

Nowadays, huskies are often used for sled racing, a sport where a team of 4-10 dogs pull a sleigh.

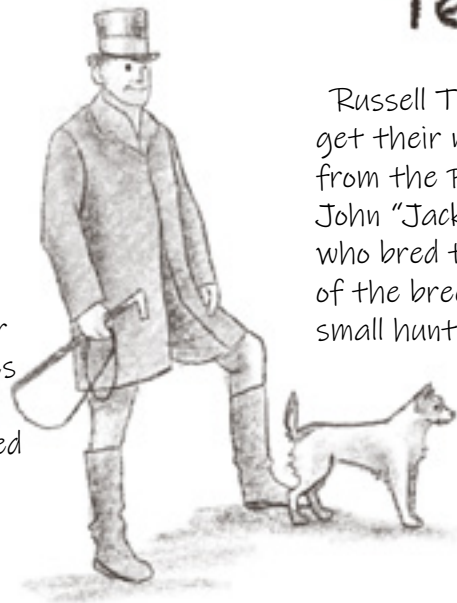


Russell Terriers are avid diggers, thanks to being bred to hunt small vermin.

A Jack Russell was the star of a TV show and book series called "Wishbone". The main dog actor was actually named Soccer.

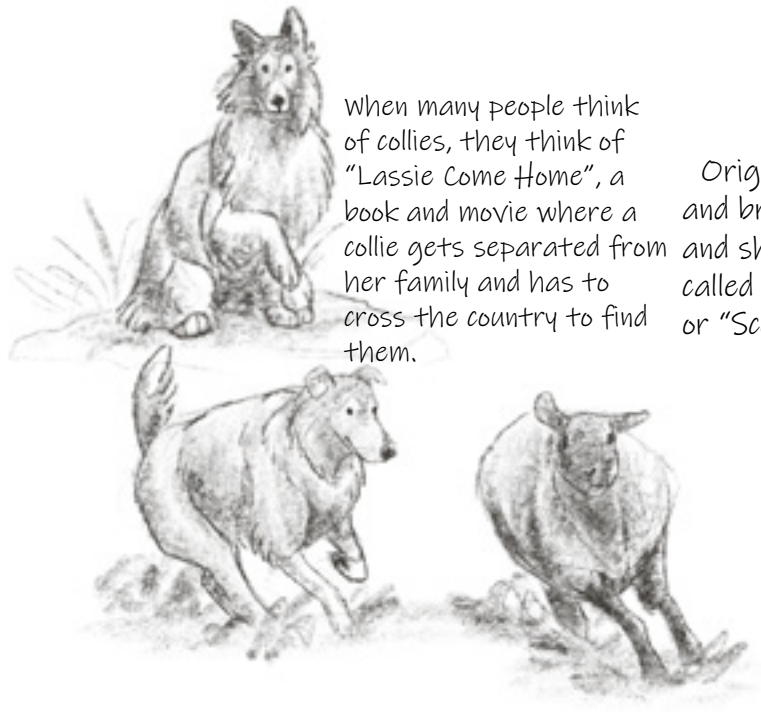


# Russell Terrier

Originating in Scotland and bred to herd cattle and sheep, collies are also called "Scottish Collies" or "Scotch Collies".

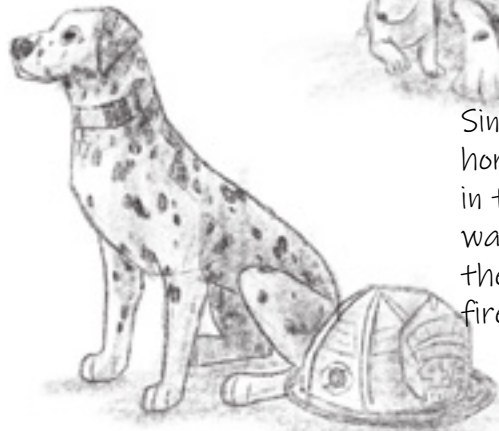


Dalmatians have a higher chance of being deaf, since their mainly white coat lacks melanin.
